**At Beech Academy**, we are all delighted to have witnessed the growth of our 'Academy Council' since its inception. Initially, the work undertaken by colleagues was as part of a 'Transition Board' in the Spring and Summer of 2022 to prepare the school and wider stakeholders for joining Nexus on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2022. This process was both collaborative and seamless and our transition completed right on time, to the delight of our children, families and colleagues.

Subsequently, the transition board became the 'Academy Council' from the autumn term in 2022 and has since been instrumental in providing the support and challenge for school leaders which, in turn has enabled our leaders to further develop the school and implement a clear and focused School Improvement Plan. Members of our Academy Council are becoming more and more prevalent within the day-to-day work of the school. In October, we held a development session for members that focused on the current self-evaluation for Beech and our subsequent priorities for this academic year. This proved to be a really helpful opportunity for members to ask a range of questions to better understand the direction of the school and to see Beech 'in action' on a normal working day. Since this time, our members have also been involved with supporting initiatives and activities during the autumn term. Recently, one member has supported our Literacy Coordinator, Bev Cooper to help with our 'Parent Literacy Workshops' which have proved to be a roaring success and our Community Governor accompanied pupils and colleagues on a recent trip to watch 'A Christmas Carol' at Nottingham Playhouse theatre.

At Beech, we are very much looking forward to continuing the journey that we have begun with our Academy Council and are really excited to watch it grow from strength to strength. We would like to offer a huge 'thank you' to all of our current members for the work that they do to support the school. It is both appreciated and valued in equal measure.

## **Pupil Parliament at Beech Academy**

The Pupil Parliament at Beech have had a very busy and exciting year. In September 2022 the first School Council was elected with each tutor group voting for a member of their class to represent them at Council meetings. Following this, in November, and with the help of Nexus, the School Council converted to a 'Pupil Parliament' model and the school council representatives converted to MPs. During the remainder of the year, our MPs formed a 'Cabinet' with a Prime Minister and positions including; Minister for Health and Minister for Sport.

The MPs then focused their work on asking 'constituents' how they felt about school and what changes they would like to consider making. A common theme that many pupils seemed to want to change was lunchtime arrangements. Thanks to the hard work of our MPs liaising with Senior Leaders, the school now uses a new catering company for lunches which has greatly improved the quality of the food being served. Also, our Pupil Parliament have introduced a number of lunchtime clubs offering a variety of extra-curricular activities including; Art, Football, Nature, Music and Chess and even an Eco-Schools club.

This year, the Prime Minister and three other, chosen MPs have been inducted into our new 'House of Lords' where they will serve as peers, overseeing and advising the new Pupil Parliament wherever they can help. Beech have recently taken part in UK Parliament Week by holding elections for new MPs in each class. Some of last year's MPs have been re-elected and some are completely new and we look forward to watching their progress this year!
