We're making a targeted effort to fill our remaining Director vacancies so I'll be sharing more news in the coming months as we secure more volunteers to take on the heavy (unpaid!) responsibilities of governing our Multi Academy Trust.

We have a few new governors joining our local governing bodies too, with **Carol Davison** joining Kelford in the summer term and a host of other new governors in the process of visiting our schools with a view to joining us. I'd also like to thank Christine Brodhurst-**Brown** for putting herself forward to be the new chair of Kelford LGB. Chris brings great experience and enthusiasm to the role.

More capital works are planned for the coming academic year and we're adding four new classrooms to the Abbey site as demand for places in or schools continues to grow. I've spent a lot of time over the summer talking to our local authority partners about how we can develop an exciting new offer for children and young people with additional **needs** and vulnerabilities. It's early days, but we have some exciting possibilities we're exploring!
