Main purpose of the job:

In addition to the responsibilities of a teacher, the Head of KS4 will provide leadership across KS4 provision and lead on an element of the new Ofsted toolkit. The role combines high-quality classroom practice with strategic and relational leadership, ensuring curriculum pathways are ambitious, coherent and responsive to the needs of all pupils. Work together as part of the SLT to support with the development and ongoing plans for the school as a whole.

Safeguarding

- Complete and facilitate annual reviews for KS4.
- Support colleagues through coaching, modelling and professional dialogue, promoting consistently strong classroom practice.
- Work alongside the Pupil Support Team (PST) to ensure that behaviour is managed well in a strategic and planned way.
- Contribute to quality assurance activities, including learning walks, work scrutiny, moderation and pupil voice, using evidence to inform improvement.
- Use assessment information, EHCP outcomes and wider evidence to evaluate impact and support curriculum refinement.



- Oversee and support accreditation and curriculum pathways, ensuring they are appropriate, accessible and meaningful.
- Strengthen partnerships with families, professionals and external agencies to support successful transitions and positive destinations for KS4 pupils.
- Contribute to staff development through CPD, sharing best practice and, where appropriate, leading or supporting training.
- Support leadership planning through contributions to self-evaluation and school improvement planning related to KS4.
